size about 52 x 52

- Bright Fabric for Star Points
   4 or more Fat Quarters assorted fabrics that are solids or read as solids
- 2. Very Dark or Very Light Background for Stars- % of a yard
- 3. Bright Print for the Star Centers-  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard.
- 4. Medium Fabric for the 4 corners of the Star blocks- 2/3 yard
- 5. Sashing Strips- fabric of your-choice. I used a stripe- 1 yard
- 6. Inner Border 3/4 of a yard
- 7. Outer Border- 1 yard

Cutting Directions- for 9 star blocks Fabric 1.

Supply List

Cut from each fat quarter 4 or more squares that are 3 and 7/8 - 36 for 9 blocks

Fabric 2 Cut 9 squares 7 1/4

Fabric 3 Cut 9 squares 6 1/2

Fabric 4 Cut 36 squares 3 1/2 for the corner squares

Fabric 5 cut 6 strips 3 inches

Inner Border Cut -6 strips 2 1/2 inches

Outer Border Cut- 6 strips 4 inches




16 PATCH BLOCK QUILT FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

For the samples I made of this pattern,

- FOR THE BLACK FABRIC AND SCRAP sample I used **2 yards** of black and the colors were from pieces that measured **8" by 15"**, each block was from a new color so all blocks are different. If you want to add borders to this quilt, more yardage would be needed. This quilt measures 60" by 60"
- FOR THE BLUE SAMPLE I used scraps of blue that measured **9"** by **18"**, all the blocks are different and **2 yards** of background. If you want borders on this quilt, more yardage would be needed. this measures 56" by 70"
- FOR THE SOLID COLOR sample each was cut from different fabric, all were from fat quarters, there are 36 blocks in this quilt and it measures 72" square.
- The blocks finish at 12" square, if you want to make it smaller or larger adjust to your needs.

# Pattern 701: One Pinwheel Rail Fence

# Fabric Requirements:

# Rail fence:

- Fabric #1) 1 1/4 yard Dark
- Fabric #2) 1 1/4 yard Medium
- Fabric #3) 1 1/4 yard Medium
- Fabric #4) 1 yard Light

# Pinwheel:

- Fabric #5) 3/8 yard Light
- Fabric #6) 3/8 yard Dark
- Inner Border I used 2 ½" strips You will need ¾ yd.
- Outer Border I used 5" strips You will need 1 ¼ yd.
- Binding I used assorted 2 ½" coordinating strips of fabric to make a scrappy binding

Block Size: 8" finished


# Cutting:

- From fabric #1, #2, and #3, cut 16 strips of each color that are 2 1/2" wide x width of fabric.
- From fabric#4, cut 11 strips that are 2 1/2" wide x width of fabric. Cut the strips into 6 ½" long pieces. You should have a total of 64. (Set aside the leftover pieces for another project.)
- Further cutting instructions will be given at class.


Judy has been playing around with stars, and now you can, too! This free Quilt of the Moment is a chance for you to expand your rotary cutting repertoire. The quilt has only 4 different pieces, but 3 of them are not typically found in rotary-cut quilts. The cutting is easier than you think, though, and the sewing is a breeze. (That's a "Blustery Day" joke!). Quilt pattern has been used with permission from Judy Martin @Crosslet-Griffith Publishing Company. Quilt Size: 55" x 72" Block Size: 8½" finished (9" from raw edge to raw edge) Set 6 x 8 blocks Requires: 24 Blocks and 24 Border Blocks See the color key and cut blocks referring to separate cutting directions that will be handed out at the 2013 WCOQG retreat. To make smaller quilt, use half of yardage and cut half as many strips.

# Blustery Day Throw Quilt:

1 yard teal #1 (darkest) Cut 6 strips - 24+" (piece #1-A) Cut pieces later Cut 3 strips - 2" Cut 24 rectangles - 2" x 43/4" (piece #1-B) 1 yard teal #2 (dark) Cut 6 strips - 2¼+" (piece #2-A) Cut 3 strips - 2" Cut 24 rectangles - 2" x 4\%" (piece #2-B) 2 yard teal #3 (light) Cut 4 strips - 2½" x 72" (border will be cut to size needed later) Cut 6 strips - 24+" (piece #3-A) Cut 3 strips - 2" Cut 24 rectangles - 2" x 4¾" (piece #3-B) Remaining fabric will be used for binding 1 yard teal #4 (lightest) Cut 6 strips - 21/4+" (piece #4-A) Cut 3 strips - 2" Cut 24 rectangles - 2" x 4\%" (piece #4-B) 1 yard green #5 (dark) Cut 5 strips - 5" Cut 24 rectangles - 5" x 8" (piece D) 1 yard green #6 (light) Cut 5 strips - 5" Cut 24 rectangles - 5" x 8" (piece D) 1 yard beige #7 (dark) Cut 6 strips - 4 1/8" Cut 48 squares - 4 1/8" x 4 1/8" (piece C) 1 yard beige #8 (light) Cut 6 strips - 4 1/8" Cut 48 squares - 4 1/8" x 4 1/8" (piece C) 3 ¾ yards backing Any questions, please contact: Sharon Finkenbine <a href="mailto:sharon55@woh.rr.com">sharon55@woh.rr.com</a> 937-726-5021 cell/text






# //String around the Collar Purse//

Materials needed for the class
One pattern String around the collar.
Supplies: Main print 1/2 yds, Liner print 7/8 yd. Batting 3/8 yd, 3/8 yd heavy Pellon, 1/4 yd velcro 3/4in wide.
Additional supplies: Basic sewing supplies, sewing machine, pins, scissors, thread, rotory cutter, ruler at least 20 in long, removable fabric marker, glue stick, jean or leather needle for sewing machine.
To get a jump start on the project, have 2 11inch by 17 inch pieces quilted.

This quilt looks complicated, but it's ONE SIMPLE BLOCK!

Bright Fabric*	1 yd.* or 8 FQ's for Variety	3 yds.* 12 FQ's for Variety	7 1/2 yds.* 30 FQ's for Variety	
Inner Border	1/4 yd.	5/8 yd.	1 yd.	
Outer Border	5/8 yd.	2 yds. or 2 1/2 yd -no seams	2 3/4 yds. or 3 1/3 yd-no seams	
Binding	1/2 yd.	2/3 yd.	1 yd.	
Backing	1 1/2 yds.	4 1/4 yds.	9 yds.	

\* Suggestion: Collect fat quarters of the brights for a good variety!

If you are one who likes to cut before the retreat...here are the cutting instruct

Crib Size: (48) 4" finished block
Light Background Fabric
Cut (3) 2" strips-sub cut in to (48) 2" squares
Cut (3) 2 ½" strips-sub cut in to (48) 2 ½" squares (draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each of these 2 ½" squares)

Cut (3) 2 %" strips-sub cut in to (48) 2 %" squares (draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each of these 2 %" squares)

Bright Fabric

For EACH BLOCK (48 total) you will need (1) 2" square
(cut a variety of bright fabrics for a more interesting look)

Twin/Lap Size: (48) 8" finished block

Light Background Fabric

Cut (5) 3 1/2" strips-sub cut in to (48) 3 1/2" squares

Cut (5) 4" strips-sub cut in to (48) 3 1/2" squares (draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each of these 4" squares)

Bright Fabric

For EACH BLOCK (48 total) you will need (1) 3 1/2" square

(cut a variety of bright fabrics for a more interesting look)

Queen Size: (120) 8" finished block

Light Background Fabric

Cut (13-15) 4" strips-sub cut in to (120) 3 1/2" squares


Cut (13-15) 4" strips-sub cut in to 120 4" squares (draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each of these 4" squares)

Bright Fabric

For EACH BLOCK (120 total) you will need (1) 3 1/2" square

(cut a variety of bright fabrics for a more interesting look)

## **Materials**

 yd. (total) of background fabric and/or scraps that have the same value/color


1 yd. (total) of assorted prints-same color family or ones that just look good together

1/2 yd. for binding

# Cutting instructions:

From background fabric cut 100 rectangles, each 2 1/2" x 4 1/2".

From assorted prints cut 100 rectangles, each 2 1/2" x 4 1/2".

I made this quilt in the bright colors that I see in Mexican Restaurants...in keeping with the "Fiesta" them

It can be made with fabries of your choosing: Fabrie A: (red prints) 2 ¼ yards Fabrie B: (yellow prints) 1 ½ yards Fabrie C: (green prints) 1 ½ yards Fabrie D: (gold prints) 3 yards

This class will teach and use the "Fast Flying Geese" method to make the pieced geese blocks.

Fiesta Flower Garden - machine piecing "Y" seams 63" x 78"

# Yardage:

14, ¼ yard cuts for the flowers

14 yard for the centers

1 ½ yards for the black holding the flowers together and the binding

5/8 yard for the inner white border

1 ½ yard for the outer border

You will need 58 copies of the hexagon pattern sheet (two for the center color and the 56 for rest of the flower), 10 copies of the diamond pattern sheet (for holding the flowers together) and 3 copies of the small triangle pattern sheet (for holding the flowers together). Note: the diamond and small triangle sheets are the same. There is a marked off area where you cut off the small triangle. They can be used over again so you can make fewer if you want to. (I will give you the diamond and small triangle pattern at the retreat.) I print them on the dull side of freezer paper using my printer then iron the freezer paper sheets onto the back on the fabric. I then cut them out using scissors and gently take off the freezer paper. If your printer will not print on freezer paper you can print the copies onto regular paper and use Wonderunder to fuse the copies to the dull side of freezer paper. Please have enough hexagons cut out of your fabric for 2 flowers.





Supply list for Gift Card Holders
Felt of various colors for envelope and design (can get 2 long envelopes or 3 horizontal envelopes per felt sheet), matching sewing thread or DMC thread, DMC for hanger, scissors (short bladed sharp scissors best if you have), pins shorter than quilting pins, sewing needle, zip lock bag for pattern pieces, Elmer's glue and toothpicks for gluing. Optional items: fine line marker, roller ball pen, small buttons, small black snaps for eyes, small beads or accents you desire, fabric and batting.

The Gift Card Holder is a quick project you can complete at retreat for that sense of accomplishment. The holders are original designs by Barbara Blackburn and hold a gift card that can then be hung on your Christmas tree. Most of the samples are made of felt with an appliqué design on them. If you prefer, you can make them out of fabric and quilt them like two of the samples. The appliqué technique used will be explained in class for those who have not tried appliqué before.

The patterns for the snowflake, embroidered Christmas tree, Penguin #1, and gingerbread boy will be included in the class instructions. Barbara got carried away while creating the patterns so other patterns will be available at an additional fee if you are interested. If you would like the additional designs, please sign your name and which pattern sheet you would like at the display table and it will be given to you at retreat along with the class pattern. You will not have to sign a sheet at the display table unless you want the additional designs and you must sign up for the class on the registration form that is turned in to Joan Maxwell before you can get the extra designs at retreat. Your sign up with Retreat registration will get you the designs for the class itself if that is all of the designs you are interested in.

If you would like to make the patterns from fabric, Wonder Under or Heat N' Bond was forgotten on the supply list.



# Quilt as you stitch - An Original Design by Kay Borchers

**Sock Supplies:** Sock outline (pattern provided at retreat)

5" x 6" batting (Warm & Natural works well)

5" x 6" felt for backing

5" x 1/2" piece of felt or ribbon (hanger)

7" x 2 ½" piece of white fleece or felt (cuff)

2" x ¾" piece of thin plastic (name holder)

¾" x ½" piece of sew-on Velcro (closure)

1 ¼" x ½" piece of white paper (name)

assorted Christmas fabric cut into strips of 1" to 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide in assorted lengths (4" minimum

length)

Sewing supplies such as thread, scissors, etc.

# **Seat Supplies:**

Round Seat – 2 fabrics – 5/8 yds. of each

Elastic - 1/4" wide - 19 inches long

Elongated – 2 fabrics – 5/8 yds. of each

Elastic  $-\frac{1}{4}$ " wide -21 inches long.

Pattern – Trace around your toilet seat onto tissue paper, cardboard, or poster board
